Anand, a 30-something city dweller compelled to spend a 10-day mourning period for his father in the rugged countryside of western India, tenderly bonds with a local farmer who is struggling to stay unmarried. As the mourning ends, forcing his return, Anand must decide the fate of his relationship born under duress.

SYNOPSIS

Anand (30), a call-center employee in Mumbai, is forced to spend ten days at his ancestral village to mourn the loss of his father at the behest of his mother, Suman (50).

As the mourning period begins post-cremation, he faces subtle but relentless badgering from relatives to get married so that at least his mother finds the pleasure of seeing him settled. Anand finds himself stifled, as coming out to extended family could alienate his mother from the relatives when she needs them the most.

He finds solace in his childhood friend, Balya (30), as he accompanies him on his daily outings into the mountains to herd goats. Balya has been using the 'educated girls favoring city-dwellers over farmers' as a ruse to stay unmarried as he undergoes similar pressures relating to his sexuality from his family.

To escape their pressures, the two men spend time together. Hailing from different worlds but bound by childhood memories, they connect over their common struggle. As the days pass, their intimacy blooms emotionally and physically. With the mourning period ending, will their burgeoning bond survive beyond the ten days?

Sabar Bonda (Cactus Pears) explores the delicate bonds that develop under duress and the future of it.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Sabar Bonda (Cactus Pears) is my deeply personal reimagining of the grieving period I experienced in my ancestral village in 2016. Born and raised in a Mumbai slum by a chauffeur father and a homemaker mother, my parents accepted my sexuality, but my extended family in the village was unaware. During this grieving period, they began pressuring me to marry within a year, as per custom. This constant pressure overshadowed my grief, leaving me longing for an escape I couldn't find at the time.

Through this film, I explore the possibility of solace and freedom by allowing my protagonist to experience moments of connection and respite with an estranged childhood friend. These moments gradually blossom into a tender bond, making this film a journey that begins with tragedy and moves toward hope and positivity.

To ensure authenticity, I cast actors from the region where the film was shot, despite the challenges of finding local talent willing to portray queer characters due to cultural stigma. After three years of searching, Bhushaan Manoj and Suraaj Suman were selected for their backgrounds as trained theater actors and their six-year friendship, which added depth and realism to the characters' bond and intimacy. Their grounded and relatable appearances were also crucial to portraying queer individuals as ordinary people rather than idealized figures, further humanizing their story.

My personal experiences shaped Sabar Bonda to reflect the realities of lower-class queer life in India, challenging the misconception that queer experiences are limited to the upper class. By weaving together urban and rural experiences, the film aims to normalize queerness and celebrate its presence in all layers of society.

The characters of the parents in the film are inspired by my parents whose love and wisdom led them to accept my sexuality without any conflict. By highlighting this aspect of acceptance without sensationalizing struggle, the film offers a fresh perspective that redefines queer narratives and fosters hope.

I used static frames to capture the stillness and sluggish pace of that time in the village. And although at its core it's a romance drama, it has no background score. I wanted to use layered soundscape to paint the urban and rural spaces to further enhances the tender quality of the film.

I shot this film in a small village called Kharshinde, where my mother was born and raised. We filmed several scenes near a man-made lake in the village, created decades ago due to the lack of a natural water source. When the lake was being dug, my mother, then a teenager, worked as one of the laborers. Knowing that this landscape holds a part of my mother's personal history made the experience deeply meaningful for me.

Rohan Parashuram Kanawade is a self-made filmmaker raised in a Mumbai slum by a chauffeur father and homemaker mother. Transitioning from interior design to filmmaking, Rohan's short films have screened globally. His debut feature, *Sabar Bonda (Cactus Pears)*, was developed at the Venice Biennale College Cinema 2022-2023 and participated in platforms such as Film Bazaar, Venice Gap Financing Market, and Goes to Cannes. His short films include *U Ushacha (U for Usha)*, *Khidkee (Window)*, *Sundar (Beautiful)*, and *Ektya Bhinti (Lonely Walls)*.

Neeraj Churi champions South Asian LGBTQIA+ storytelling through Lotus Visual Productions. His feature *A Place of Our Own* won the Audience Choice Award at SXSW 2023. His projects include short *Holy Curse* (winner Best Short Film at the Oscar qualifying Tasveer Film Festival); short *Sheer Qorma* (winner Audience Choice Award at Frameline) and *Queer Parivaar* (winner IRIS Prise Best British Short) He collaborates with non-profit orgs to support underrepresented filmmakers via grants and mentorship programs. An alumnus of the New York Film Academy, he also holds degrees in information science management.

Mohamed Khaki, a lifelong film enthusiast from Tanzania, has lived in Toronto since 1975, retiring after a career in finance. His passion for world cinema grew by attending TIFF annually since 1978. He is now producing independent films in India. Mohamed is past President of *Raag-Mala* Toronto, which promotes Indian classical music, and remains as its Artistic Director.

Kaushik Ray, a writer-director, runs Taran Tantra Telefilms Ltd, focusing on LGBTQ+ South Asian stories, intersectionality, minority rights, women's rights, and otherwise untold stories. *Sabar Bonda* is his first feature as producer, with prior credits on several award-winning shorts. His debut short as writer-director, starring Lilette Dubey, premiered at BFI Flare in 2024.

Naren Chandavarkar is a Mumbai-based composer, sound designer, producer, and founder of Moonweave Films. As a producer, his next film *Shadowbox (Baksho Bondi)* received the CNC post-production fund in 2024 and is set to premiere in 2025. His other credits include *Second Chance* (Proxima Competition, Karlovy Vary, 2024), *And, Towards Happy Alleys* (Panorama, Berlinale, 2023), and *Balekempa* (FIPRESCI Award, IFFR, 2018). As a sound designer and composer his credits include *The Disciple* (Venice Competition, 2020), *Newton* (Forum, Berlinale, 2017), *Ship of Theseus* (TIFF, 2012) and *The Shepherdess and Seven Songs* (Encounters, Berlinale, 2020). He has been nominated for a Hollywood Music in Media Award, International Cinephile Society Award, and a Canadian Screen Award.

Sid is an entrepreneur and M&E veteran with over 20 years of experience in film. Known for his expertise in cinematography, VFX, digital workflows, and color grading, he has worked on acclaimed films such as the Oscar-winning *The Elephant Whisperers*, Oscar-nominated *Writing with Fire* and *All That Breathes*, and Peabody-winning *While We Watched*. Jim Sarbh is a Mumbai-based film and theatre actor, producer, and founder of Wonderful Entertainment. His performances in films like *Neerja*, *Padmaavat*, and *Gangubai Kathiawadi*, and series like *Made in Heaven*, and Rocket Boys, have earned him several awards and nominations, including a Filmfare Award, and an International Emmy nomination. Sarbh was a Forbes India '30 Under 30' honoree for his contributions to the Indian theatre as an actor and a director. As a producer, Sarbh has co-produced *Baksho Bondi*, which is set to premiere in 2025.

Bhushaan Manoj is an actor with over a decade of experience in theatre and film. Trained in Electronics Engineering, he transitioned to acting, earning a Master's in Theatre from Pune University. Bhushaan's training includes Kalaripayattu, an ancient martial art that enhances his physical expressiveness and performance strength. Bhushaan has performed in acclaimed productions like *Macbeth, Anol Shalom,* and *Ashcharya Chudamani*, directed by the celebrated Sri Prasanna. A recipient of a fellowship from the Kolkata Centre for Creativity, he has explored Indian theatre practices to deepen his craft. Combining emotional depth with physical authenticity, Bhushaan's disciplined approach has established him as a unique voice in Indian cinema and theatre.

Suraaj Suman is a versatile actor trained in both Western and traditional Indian theatre techniques. With a Master's degree in Theatre from Pune University, he has worked on diverse roles, including performances in *Macbeth, Kunacha Kunala Mel Nai*, and *Ashcharya Chudamani*, directed by Sri Prasanna. Suraaj's method combines physicality, emotional depth, and cultural authenticity, refined under Prasanna's guidance. Beyond acting, he has contributed to preserving Indian folk art through initiatives like Lokkala 2020. Jayshri Jagtap is a multifaceted actor, teacher, and poet who transitioned from education to theatre and acting. With an M.A. and B.Ed., she began her artistic journey with Aavishkaar Theatre Group, refining her craft under the guidance of seasoned mentors. She made her film debut in the Marathi movie *Maauli* and has since appeared in *Bandishala*, *Soyrik*, and popular Marathi web series such as *Pet Puraan* and *Kaalasutra*. On television, she is known for her roles in serials like *Sukh Mhanje Nakki Kay Asat* and *Aai Tuljabhavani*. Her theatre work includes *Dagad Aani Maati*, which was showcased at the Kolkata National Theatre Festival. Jayshri's diverse and enriching journey highlights her dedication to the performing arts, establishing her as a rising talent in Marathi cinema and beyond.

Vikas Urs is an independent cinematographer whose work focuses on deeply personal and visually unique films. His credits include *Pedro* and *Shivamma*, both premiered at Busan and earned acclaim at BFI London, Nantes, Pingyao and Fajr followed by *Alaav (Hearth and Home)* and *Body* which premiered at Nantes and IFFK 2024. His upcoming film *Tiger's Pond* is slated for major premiere this year. Vikas's work on documentaries like *Against the Tide* (Sundance) showcases his expertise in visual storytelling in the non fiction space. Experimental projects like *Wanderers Between Worlds* have been exhibited globally, including Google Arts and Culture, cementing his place as a standout cinematographer in contemporary Indian cinema.

Boloy Kumar Doloi is a sound re recording mixer and designer with over 17 years of experience, contributing to over 200 feature films across multiple languages, including English and Hindi. Rajamouli, and Vishal Bharadwaj to name a few solidifying his reputation as a skilled and versatile professional.
